Dr. Chiang studied medicine at the School of Medicine, Taipei Medical University and got his Master of Medical Science at the Graduate Institute of Clinical Medicine, College of Medicine, National Taiwan University, Taipei. After the Stanford fellowship in Sleep Disorders Center (2005), he has devoted himself to sleep medicine and technology. Currently, he is the director of the Sleep Technology Special Interest Group at the National Taiwan University, Taiwan. He is also president of International Sleep Science and Technology Association (ISSTA), Berlin Headquarter. In June 2010, he received the “Investigator Award” from the American Academy of Sleep Medicine and an invitation as a visiting professor by the University of Washington, and Mayo Clinic, USA (2011).

He is the only Asian scholar to have been honored by the European Sleep Research Society as a Board Certificated Grandparent Somnologist, joining another 121 world class sleep experts (2012 and 2013). He also coordinated the ISSTA Consortium for the application of the EU project Horizon 2020 with 12 other prestigious institutes in EU and Asia. He became the Director of Sleep Technology Academic-Industrial Consortium, under the Ministry of Science and Technology Taiwan. As previous governor general of a national project, namely “International Smart Wellness Park”, he co-directed the National Demo Site of Long-Term Care under the Taipei Veterans General Hospital.

Dr. Chiang also chief-edited the first textbook in the field of sleep technology - “Introduction to Modern Sleep Technology” (2012), and is now sitting on the editorial board of several academic journals.
