Professor Marco Ferrari (DOB: 05/02/1959) is an educationist, researcher, specialist in Prosthodontics and Dental Materials. He graduated from the School of Medicine and Surgery, University of Pisa (1983) and obtained his General Dentistry degree at the University of Siena (1987). He attended the Post-Graduate Program in Prosthodontics at Tufts University, Boston (1987-1988), and obtained his PhD at the University of Amsterdam (1990). In 1992 he became a faculty member, School of Dental Medicine, Tufts University, Boston, where he was appointed Research Professor in 1999. After returning to Italy, he started teaching at the School of Dental Medicine, Siena University as contract professor (1990), and went on to become full professor (2003). He implemented a PhD program in ‘Dental Materials and their clinical applications’ (2001), and became Director of the PhD School in ‘Biotechnologies’ (2005). He initiated a PhD Program in English (Dental Biotechnologies) thus enabling the University of Siena to establish cooperation agreements with 18 universities in Europe, Israel, USA, Japan and Brazil, and create a unique ‘dental scientific network’. He became Dean of the School of Dental Medicine, University of Siena (2003), and was appointed Vice-Rector of International Relations at the same University. He supervised 36 PhD theses (2004-present), authored 340 international publications, another 290 national publications and 190 abstracts presented in various congresses, has been cited in the literature over 18,000 times with an H-index over 47.

He is an editorial board member of 7 impact factor international dental journals, and a referee of another 10 such journals.

Research interests: restorative dentistry, implant dentistry, aesthetic dentistry, materials, composites, polymerization, metals, coating, mechanical properties, finite element analysis.
