Professor Samaranayake (DOB: December 16, 1947) is an educationist, administrator, researcher and specialist in infectious diseases. He received his BDS from the Ceylon University, Sri Lanka (1971) and his DDS from the Glasgow University, UK (1982). He was a Senior Lecturer in Oral Medicine and Pathology at the same university (UK 1978-1990). He worked at the University of Hong Kong first as a Reader in Oral Biology (1991-1997), and then as Chair Professor of Oral Microbiology (1997-2013). He was the holder of various positions - Dean of Dentistry, Hong Kong University (2004 -2008, reappointed 2009-2013) or Director, Prince Philip Dental Hospital, Hong Kong (2004-2013). He was also Professor of Oral Microbiomes and Infection and Head of the School of Dentistry, University of Queensland, Australia (2014-2016).

Since 2017 he has been Professor and Vice-Dean, College of Dental Medicine, Sharjah University, UAE. He received several major honors and awards - Distinguished Scientist Award of IADR (2010), King James IV Professorship of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, UK (2012), the Tam Wah-Ching Endowed Professor in Dental Science, Hong-Kong University (2010-2013). He has served as member of various editorial boards and university exam boards. He has published over 350 original, peer reviewed research and review articles, 31 book chapters and more than 150 abstracts, more than 450 scientific communications, and has been cited in the literature over 19,000 times, with an H-index of 73.

Research interests: (1) infections in medically compromised individuals; (2) oral candidiasis; (3) clinical oral microbiology; (4) infection control in dental practice.
